HUSKINS COOPERATIVE PROGRAM AGREEMENT

This agreement between the Board of Trustees of a North Carolina Community College and a Board of Education of a North Carolina Public or Private School System or High School is to establish a joint program of college credit courses for qualified high school students in accordance with NC General Statutes 115D-20(4), 23 NCAC 2C. 0305 and, NC Community College State Board approved policies and procedures, and applicable North Carolina Community College System Office numbered memoranda.

Statement of Purpose(s)

The purpose of this agreement is to provide curriculum courses to Granville County Schools student population that can be used as high school elective credit as well as college credit at the community college level. The college will extend course offerings to high school students that are not otherwise available.

Criteria for selecting students

The "qualified high school student" must be in grades 9-12, have good academic standing, meet the college's Placement Test requirements and benefit from advanced level instruction.

Cost for college textbooks and other fees: (Statement must include who is responsible for these costs/fees)

All textbooks for classes will be purchased by the school system or students. Vance-Granville Community College will provide facility space for classes at the South Campus if space is not available at the high school. Cosmetology supplies with the exception of mannequins (to be purchased by students) will be provided by Vance-Granville Community College.

Note: Cooperative Agreement instructors are employed by Vance-Granville Community College and are under the direct supervision of program heads at the college. The high school will be responsible for providing any accommodations needed for high school students. Students will be held to disciplinary actions of the college as well as the high school and will be held to the college's attendance policies.

Evaluation methods and measures: (Statement must include the process for planning and conducting the annual evaluation)

Instructors and class content will be evaluated through a survey by students two times per year (once per semester). Program Heads will do an in-class observation evaluation at least once per year.

Stated provisions for termination and/or renewal of this agreement:


