ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS SPRING ADMISSION



MISSION STATEMENT

The LPN to ADN Transition program supports the mission of the North Carolina Community College System and the mission of Vance-Granville Community College (VGCC). The faculty is committed to providing accessible high-quality nursing education to meet the diverse and changing healthcare needs of the service area and to promoting the development of qualified students prepared for the professional role of registered nurse at the entry level. Graduates of this program meet the educational requirements to take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN®).

ADMISSION PROCEDURES

Students are admitted to the LPN to ADN Transition program (A45110L) in accordance with policies set by VGCC. Each applicant is required to meet the minimum admission eligibility requirements as set by the College. Meeting minimum eliqibility requirements does not quarantee admission into the program, only an opportunity for consideration. Completion of the VGCC LPN to ADN Transition program does not guarantee success in passing the National Council Licensure Exam (NCLEX®).

The selection process for this program includes: PROGRAM APPLICATION Process Completion (must be completed for consideration for the LPN to ADN Transition Program). Regulations, procedures, and course requirements are subject to change as necessary and without prior notice.

NOTE: This program is offered at the Main Campus in Henderson.

PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS

- 1. Apply to VGCC. Designate LPN to ADN Transition program as the desired program of study. Deadline for the online application to VGCC for the Spring Admission to the LPN to ADN Transition Program is the last business day in September. Applicants will be placed into a Pre-Health Curriculum (Associate in General Education-General Science A10300S), until selected into the program. Submit official transcripts. Students must be eligible to enroll in ENG 111 and MAT 152 without a pre-requisite or co-requisite course in order to be eligible for admission into the desired Nursing program.
 - Test scores and/or developmental coursework must be completed within 10 years of the PROGRAM APPLICATION
 - PROCESS deadline.
- 2. The following items are required as part of the PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS:
 - A. Completion of an LPN diploma program with official transcripts sent to VGCC to verify completion.
 - B. Current listing on the North Carolina Board of Nursing website with an LPN license.
 - C. A cumulative GPA of 2.8 or higher is required for admission to the LPN to ADN Transition program. A grade of "C" or better is required for all general education courses.
 - D. Completion of BIO 168, BIO 169, and ENG 111 with a "C" or better before beginning the program. BIO course(s) required for the program must be completed within 10 years of the PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS deadline.
- 3. Schedule a meeting with your Academic Advisor Kimberly Robertson at robertsonk@vgcc.edu

- 4. Schedule a meeting with the Consultation Committee for the VGCC Nursing Programs once cleared by your academic advisor.
- 5. The PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS deadline is the last business day in October.

CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK: VGCC cautions applicants that the North Carolina Board of Nursing (NCBON) on its application form asks the following question: "Have you ever been convicted of a misdemeanor or felony (excluding a minor traffic violation?" The NCBON reserves the right to refuse to grant graduates a nursing license even if the graduate passes the NCLEX-RN based on their past criminal record. If this will hinder your progression, please visit the VGCC Admissions Office for more information on alternative programs of study at VGCC.

The new SHS admission processes for Nursing will select students based on the completion of the listed minimum requirements and on a first completion basis. If nursing is your program of choice, it is important that you begin the process now.
