During the fall 2010 semester, VGCC convened a 25-member Task Force to take a critical look at student advising processes and procedures. Leading the effort was nationally-known expert Dr. Ruth Darling, a consultant from the National Academic Advising Association (NACADA). A former president of NACADA, Dr. Darling serves as Assistant Provost for Student Success at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville. The task force included faculty and staff members from all four of VGCC's campuses. Their findings will help make VGCC a national leader in developing an advising "curriculum" that guides students toward successfully realizing their academic goals.

New Traditions:

The College Mace

At the May 2011 commencement exercises, President Randy Parker introduced a new college tradition: the VGCC Mace. Maces evolved over centuries from medieval weapons into ceremonial objects used by colleges and universities at formal occasions. The mace was designed by retired VGCC Dean of Student Services Frank Madigan and crafted by Michael G. Lassiter, Jr., a VGCC alumnus and owner/operator of Bullock's of Henderson. The black-and-gold top of the mace, or "boss," represents education and includes the college seal, Below the boss are the official seals of the four counties served by the college, Vance, Granville, Franklin and Warren, one on each side. "For decades to come, the College Mace will be a distinguished symbol of the leadership this institution provides to our four counties in education," President Parker said.

Faculty & Staff: Best in the State!

Out of all the instructors throughout the 58 colleges of the North Carolina Community College System, VGCC's own Marian C. Dillahunt-Andrews (pictured, right) stood out in 2011. An instructor of developmental English and reading, Dillahunt-Andrews received the R.J. Reynolds Excellence in Teaching Award, the highest honor for an educator in the community college system. She was recognized on April 14, 2011 at the system's second annual excellence event, becoming just the second VGCC instructor in history to receive the award. Dillahunt-Andrews has taught at VGCC since 2004. She founded and serves as an advisor for the VGCC Literary Arts Club. She is known for using innovative teaching strategies, and regularly speaks to fellow instructors at conferences, on topics including the use of technology and social media. Dillahunt-Andrews earned her bachelor's degree at North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University, a master's degree in English literature at North Carolina Central University and a master of library science degree at East Carolina University. She is currently working toward a Ph.D. through Indiana University of Pennsylvania.

Dr. Angela Ballentine



Juring the 2010-2011 year, VGCC took several actions to plan for significant changes and additions to facilities in order to better serve the students and businesses of our region. In 2008, VGCC adopted a ten-year Facilities Master Plan to meet its building and growth needs, so that the college would have the initial plans for expansion in place should funds become available in the future. In 2011, college officials began working with the MBAJ architectural firm on an update of the Master Plan. The architects started researching how the college's programming, enrollment, facilities and available property have changed in the past few years, to see if the Master Plan needs to adapt to these changing conditions.

Also during the year, VGCC:

- Received preliminary plans from the architectural firm, Pearce Brinkley Cease + Lee, for a new Allied Health classroom/lab building on Main Campus, a 45,000-square-foot facility which would house all the college's current health care training programs in one location.
- Supported construction of a 12-room modular unit for Franklin County Early College High School on Franklin County property, adjacent to VGCC's Franklin County Campus, VGCC will support the transition to the new facility and agreed to let the county share the college's pump station and allow the construction of a retention pond for the modular unit on college property.
- Continued long-range planning on other college priorities, including a new, 43,000-square-foot classroom/library/student lounge building at Franklin County Campus
- Planned improvements at South Campus, including: increasing parking spaces, paving the existing parking lot, and renovations to building space being vacated due to the relocation of the South Branch of the Granville County Library to its new home.
- Purchased property opposite the college's main campus on Poplar Creek Road, which is slated to eventually become a new "Corporate Campus." This facility would house business and industry training programs and support economic development. Higher Education bond funds approved by the state's voters in 2000 were used to purchase the land.

Community & Economic Development



Project Skill-UP funds helped students complete Nurse Aide training at VGCC.

During the 2010-11 year, the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services asked VGCC to develop a new curriculum for mandatory in-service training for Direct Care Workers, who provide health-care and assistance to patients at mental health facilities. VGCC's South Campus in Creedmoor is conveniently located near the state's newest psychiatric hospital, Central Regional Hospital in Butner. Human Services Technology program head Tracy Wallace and instructor Cynthia Young wrote the "Therapeutic Care of Patients" training course, which has since been provided to other community colleges that have DHHS facilities in their areas. VGCC started training the first of around 2,000 employees in April 2011 on-site at state facilities. That was just one way in which VGCC's Community and Economic Development division met the training needs of businesses and local agencies in 2010-2011. Also during the year:

- VGCC received a Project Skill-UP grant from the North Carolina Tobacco Trust Fund Commission, which allowed the college to assist a total of 173 students during the fiscal year. Project Skill-UP funds helped students pay for tuition, books, fees and supplies in training programs such as Occupational Healthcare. The College has received Project Skill-UP funds each year since 2006, benefiting 455 students.
- Approximately 600 people browsed through booths set up by businesses and agencies from the four-county area at EXPO 2010, which was held Oct. 12, 2010 in the Civic Center. EXPO was organized by the VGCC Small Business Center and local chambers of commerce. This year's event marked the 20th anniversary of EXPO, which was first held in the Civic Center on May 10, 1990.

Sustainability

There were several ways in which VGCC went "green" in 2010-2011, as the college responded to the increasing importance of environmental sustainability in the economy of the future.

- As part of the N.C. Community College System's "Code Green" curriculum improvement initiative, five faculty members represented VGCC on the state level as content matter experts for different sectors: Carpentry program head Keith Tunstall (Building Sector), Electrical/Electronics Technology program head Robert Hudson (Energy Sector), Biology instructor Button Brady (Environment Sector), Electronics Engineering Technology program head Wesley Williams (Engineering Technology Sector) and Automotive Systems Technology program head Fred Brewer (Transportation Sector).
- Keith Tunstall completed the requirements for certification by the Building Performance Institute as a Building Analyst/Energy Auditor, focusing on residential energy consumption and options to save money by conserving energy.
- Earth Day events were held both at Main Campus and at South Campus to help educate the college and community about conservation and the natural world.
- The VGCC Board of Trustees approved the addition of a new curriculum program, Sustainability Technologies, including several certificates.
- Along with other organizations, VGCC formed a "Green Jobs Partnership" with Interstate BioEconomic Alliance, the non-profit organization that is working to create the GreenTech Campus in Warren County. The partners plan to provide training in skills needed by the agrifbio research and manufacturing businesses locating at the campus.

The VGCC Endowment Fund


