

The VGCC School of Health Sciences is continuing its commitment to the well-being of students by offering Mental Health First Aid courses across multiple programs. These courses are designed to educate students on how to recognize and respond to mental health crises, providing crucial support before professional help can be accessed. Jamisha Twitty, M.H.S. RT (R), shared her experience from the recent training, which took place on January 7th and 8th: "On Tuesday and Wednesday, Dean Thomas and I attended Mental Health First Aid training led by Cathy Davis on the south campus. Over two days, participants were educated on how to offer mental health aid to persons experiencing a mental health crisis until professional help is available. This initiative is part of the School of Health First Aid into VGCC's programs reflects the growing recognition of mental health as an essential aspect of overall health. By equipping students with these skills, the School of Health Sciences ensures that future healthcare professionals are prepared to support not only physical health but mental well-being as well.

This is a 3-year program that offers students a chance to get to know the ASRT, attend educational sessions, and network with medical imaging and radiation therapy professionals.

Selected students will complete online courses in a variety of topics to include governance overview, parliamentary procedures and advocacy, strategic planning, legal issues and affiliate compliance, association management and communication, as well as leadership principles.

Selected participants receive an in-depth look at advocacy planning and current issues, as well as airfare, housing, and a stipend for meals and other travel expenses.
